As a community impact organization, United Way is committed to providing stable core funding to member agencies, integrating new strategies to help strengthen neighbourhoods and neighbourhood organizations, and responding to the city's most pressing social issues.

In 2004, United Way invested \$51.5 million in 200 community service organizations across Toronto. This included \$48.1 million in funding to member- and grant-funded agencies, \$1.9 million to initiatives funded through special gifts from donors, and \$1.5 million leveraged through joint United Way, government and foundation partnerships.

United Way maximizes the impact of its funding by building excellence in community agencies. United Way's Organizational Capacity Building program provides top-quality management and technical assistance to the staff and board volunteers of community agencies throughout Toronto on a variety of strategic, governance, human resource, and financial planning issues.

Community impact has been the driving force behind United Way in 2004. We have continued to invest in direct services, to build on our research into critical social issues, to fund effectively through best practices, and to convene and leverage partnerships that support long-term solutions to community problems.
